

DDC and SDDC Commanders Sign Charter

On April 12, 2005, the Commander of Defense Distribution Center (DDC), BG Mike Lally, USA, and the Commander of Surface Deployment Distribution Command (SDDC), MG Charles Fletcher, USA, signed

the Distribution and Transportation Reengineering Process (DTRP) Integrated Process Team (IPT) Charter.



BG Lally endorses DDC's commitment to transportation excellence by signing the Distribution and Transportation Re-engineering Processing (DTRP) integrated process team.

The newly-signed document formally establishes the DTRP IPT. The IPT will review the processes and procedures associated with the CONUS and OCONUS transportation issues that affect the movement of sustainment supplies and retrograde movements in support of our nation's Warfighters.

Key objectives of the charter include synchronization of container movements, gaining in-transit visibility and asset visibility of the transportation movement from commercial vendor to surface ports and to DDC distribution facilities, developing a future state partnership between SDDC and DDC, and the affect of transportation management within theater operations.

The DTRP IPT is comprised of representatives of SDDC, DDC and DLA. Co-chairs are Joe Repp of SDDC and Patricia Kuntz of DDC's Logistics Operations Transportation division.

"This is another step that DDC and SDDC have taken to ensure that our Warfighters are getting the products and services they need at the time they need them and at the best value," said Kuntz. "We are committed to making the transportation portion of the distribution process as efficient as possible."

The DTRP IPT is scheduled to meet every six weeks.
