

at DDC headquarters. “Everyone at DDTP was so pleasant. They were very welcoming, and it was a pleasure to work with them, side-by-side.”



DDC celebrates Dr. Martin Luther King Day

The Defense Distribution Center (DDC) Headquarters paid tribute to Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Tuesday, Jan. 16, with a birthday celebration in the main lobby.

DDC Commander BG Michael J. Lally, USA, spoke to employees who gathered to observe the nation’s 21st annual celebration of a man of great vision and moral purpose.

This year’s theme, “In the spirit of unity and service, remember, celebrate, act,” best captures the essence of his life. If he were alive today, Dr. King would be celebrating his 77th birthday.

Dr. King’s dream for our nation set into motion such powerful, sweeping changes that their impact is still being felt today.

“Welcome everyone to this celebration in remembrance of the ideals in the pursuit of freedom and equality by a great American—the late Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.” said BG Lally. “Dr. King had a dream, a vision about an America united, one in which all Americans would prosper and live together in harmony and equality.

“ ‘When I die, don’t build a monument to me,’ ” BG Lally quoted one of Dr King’s famous messages. “ ‘Just say I tried to clothe the naked. Say

that I tried to house the homeless. I would like for somebody to say that day, that Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to give his life serving others. I want you to say that Martin Luther King, Jr. tried to love and serve humanity.’ ”

“I ask you to reflect on this year’s theme to honor his life and our nation,” BG Lally said.

“Dr. King had a dream, a vision about an America united, one in which all Americans would prosper and live together in harmony and equality.”
